**What do you need to do today?
Complete the following:**

- * First, your child must be 5 years of age on/ before September 1, 2012. You will need to show the office your child's **BIRTH CERTIFICATE** to verify his/her age.
- * Second, the state law requires immunizations. You will need to **complete the immunization form**, sign, date, and return it to the office. As your child receives additional immunizations, please call the school and inform the health associate.
- * Third, there are a number of forms that you will need to complete and return to the office. Please check to be sure you have completed the following:

- ___ **Registration Form**
- ___ **Student Information Sheet**
- ___ **Student Home Language Survey**
- ___ **Student Health History**
- ___ **Student Immunization Record**

Are there other requirements?

The Kindergarten Program & Environment

The kindergarten program is designed to allow students to explore their world through rich and exciting experiences. The learning experiences are very student centered, appropriate for the age level, and emphasize the academic, social and behavioral needs of each student. The heart of the curriculum is designed to provide learning opportunities in early literacy, mathematics, science, social studies, art, music and physical education. Social adjustment is also a key component of the kindergarten program. The social experiences will offer students the opportunity to learn and practice appropriate citizenship. Our teachers and staff strive to provide a positive, safe, nurturing environment that will contribute to student learning and prepare students for their future education. For your child to achieve and perform to his/her capabilities, it is essential that effective lines of communication between the home and school be developed. Throughout the year, your child's teacher will contact you and send home class and school information. We know that you want to be involved in your child's education. Each school provides opportunities including volunteering, working with the PTO, and other scheduled informational meetings such as open house and attending parent-teacher conferences. The research is very clear: *If a family values and is involved in their child's education, the child's achievement will be enhanced.* Please help us make education a priority for your child.

D.C. Everest Offers an "All Day" Kindergarten Program!

- * All elementary schools begin at 8:45 and end at 3:35 with the exception of Hatley.
- * The District no longer offers a "half day" kindergarten program. If you desire a "half day" for your child, you will need to provide your child's transportation home before lunch.
- * The schedule includes a major focus on reading, writing, and math literacy. Students will gain the necessary prerequisite skills to become readers, writers, and mathematicians.
- * The schedule will include, science, social studies, and center activities on various days.
- * Students have a morning, noon, and afternoon recess time.
- * After lunch, all kindergarten students have a rest time.
- * Students will also be instructed by related arts teachers in art (1 class period of 45 minutes), music (2 class periods of 30 minutes), physical education (2 class periods of 30 minutes) each week.



Transportation Information

- *Most students are transported.*
- *General bussing information will be sent to parents in late August indicating the pick-up and drop-off locations.*
- If you want your child picked up or dropped off at a location other than your residence, you must complete a **“Change in Pick-up and Drop-off”** form and return it to **First Student Bus Company by July 9th.**

Can My Child Eat Hot Lunch?

Yes, a nutritious hot lunch is served daily, and you can determine on what days your child will eat hot lunch or bring a sack lunch. Each month a menu is sent home. In addition, breakfast is served at Mountain Bay, Hatley, Rothschild and Weston daily. Parents are asked to send at least \$15.00 on the first day of school for your child's lunch and milk account. When your child's account balance is low, you will be notified. Free/reduced applications will be mailed in August.
